Mad Science

This week, our children had a fantastic time during our Science Assembly, featuring the dynamic Explosive Erica. The assembly challenged the children with the intriguing question: How could we get to Mars? They explored ideas about streamlined shapes and rocket fuel, investigating which shapes travel through the air more easily. Safety was a key focus, and Erica demonstrated the incredible power of just one drop of rocket fuel – resulting in a big bang that thrilled everyone! We also learned about orbits and experienced the cup of water experiment, which beautifully demonstrated centrifugal force.

The session was highly interactive, with many children volunteering to take part in the experiments. They discovered fascinating facts about gravity, forces, and space in a fun and engaging way.

Did you know? It takes approximately 4,500 tonnes of fuel to send a rocket to Mars!

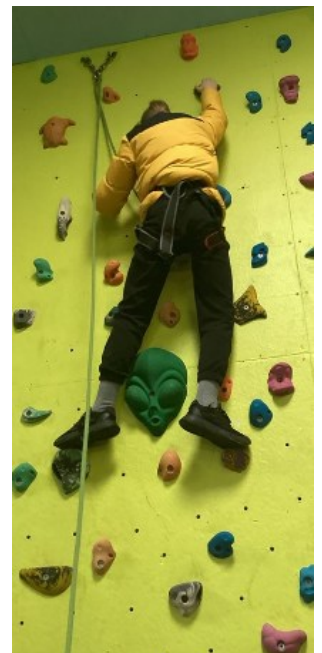


Glamara
